Re: Request to Add Approval of Sub-Registrars to Town Council Agenda, December 1, 2025

I respectfully request that the following item be added to the agenda for the Town Council meeting scheduled on December 1, 2025, for approval:

In accordance with CGS 7-65, the Town Clerk is required to appoint no fewer than two subregistrars in Watertown to issue removal, transit and burial permits, and cremation permits for deaths occurring in Watertown during the hours when the Town Clerk's office is closed. These appointments must be made in writing and approved by the Town Council.

The current subregistrars are:

- * Garrett Casey, O'Neill Funeral Home, 742 Main Street, Oakville
- * Stephanie Umbro, Hickcox Funeral Home, 195 Main Street, Watertown.

I recommend renewing the appointments of Garrett Casey and Stephanie Umbro as subregistrars for a four-year term beginning January 2, 2026 and ending January 2, 2030.

POSITION SUMMARY:

Responsible for assisting in the administration and operation of the Fire Marshal's Office. Deputy Fire Marshals report directly to the **Fire Marshal** and are responsible for conducting fire safety inspections, preparing reports, enforcing fire and life-safety codes, assisting with fire origin/cause investigations, and representing the Fire Marshal's Office as needed.

SUPERVISORY RESPONSIBILITIES:

Works under the direction and supervision of the Fire Marshal in accordance with Connecticut General Statutes 541 -§29-298(d).

SUPERVISION EXERCISED: None

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES:

- Conduct routine, follow-up, and complaint-based **fire safety inspections** to ensure compliance with the **Connecticut Fire Safety Code, Connecticut Fire Prevention Code or Hazardous Materials**, and applicable State statutes and local ordinances.
- Prepare clear and timely **inspection reports**, including documentation of violations, corrective actions, and follow-up schedules.
- Enforce applicable **fire safety statutes and local ordinances**; issue notices of violation and orders to correct as directed.
- Assist with **fire origin and cause investigations of fires and explosions**, including documentation, evidence preservation, and reporting.
- Serve as an open burning official and complete required training
- Act in the absence of, or at the direction of, the Fire Marshal including participation in **plan reviews, permit meetings, interagency coordination sessions, and community outreach events**.
- Maintain accurate **inspection, permit and certification records** as required by the Office of the State Fire Marshal.

- Participate in all required **State training and continuing education** programs (minimum 90 hours per 3-year cycle) and any additional training required by the Town of Watertown .
- Assist with fire safety education programs and presentations to residents, businesses, schools, and community organizations.
- Perform other related duties as assigned by the Fire Marshal.

REQUIRED KNOWLEDGE, SKILLS, AND ABILITIES:

- Certification as a **Connecticut Fire Marshal, Deputy Fire Marshal, or Fire Inspector**, issued by the Office of the State Fire Marshal, in accordance with CGS §29-298.
- Comprehensive knowledge of the **Connecticut Fire Safety Code, Connecticut Fire Prevention Code**, Connecticut General Statutes §29-298–§29-306, and applicable NFPA standards.
- Demonstrated experience in **fire code inspection, enforcement, and origin/cause investigation**.
- Working knowledge of **Connecticut General Statutes Chapter 541** and related codes and standards.
- Ability to complete required **continuing education (minimum 90 hours per three-year cycle)**.
- Must have a valid Connecticut driver's license or be able to obtain one in sixty (60) days.
- Strong written and verbal communication skills, including the ability to prepare detailed inspection reports and provide testimony when required.
- Ability to work independently, organize workload, and manage inspection scheduling efficiently.
- Ability record and relay information accurately.
- Ability to professionally and effectively interact with the public, property owners, Town staff, and outside agencies.
- Ability to educate diverse populations on fire prevention and present fire safety programs.
- High level of motivation and the ability to work independently with minimal supervision.
- Strong interpersonal and communication skills to collaborate effectively with other inspectors and investigators.
- A working knowledge Microsoft Office applications
- The ability to learn fire inspection/abatement software programs
- Strong ability to understand and follow written and oral instructions

EDUCATION AND EXPERIENCE:

- Experience with **plan review** and familiarity with **commercial fire protection systems** (sprinkler, alarm, and suppression systems).
- Prior experience within a **municipal Fire Marshal's office** or related public safety role.

- Familiarity with **local permitting and enforcement processes**.

SPECIAL REQUIREMENT: Must live within 30 minutes of the Town of Watertown

PHYSICAL DEMANDS:

The physical demands here are representative of those that must be met by an employee to successfully perform the essential functions of the job. Reasonable accommodations may be made to enable individuals with disabilities to perform the essential functions.

While performing the essential functions of this job, the employee is frequently required to stand, walk, use hands and fingers, handle or operate objects, controls or standard office equipment, reach with hands and arms, occasionally balance or crouch, crawl, and operate equipment necessary for job execution to include placement and climbing of ladders. The employee must occasionally lift and/or move up to 50 pounds.

Specific vision abilities required by this job include close vision, distance vision, color vision, peripheral vision, depth perception, and the ability to adjust focus.

WORK ENVIRONMENT:

This job operates in a professional office environment with regular related field work. This role routinely uses standard office equipment such as computers, phones, photocopiers, filing cabinets and fax machines.

While performing the duties of this job, the employee may occasionally work in outside-weather conditions. The employee may occasionally work near moving mechanical parts; in precarious places; may occasionally be exposed to wet and/or humid conditions, extreme cold, extreme heat, fumes or airborne particles, toxic or caustic chemicals, risk of electrical shock, and vibration. The noise level in the work environment is usually quiet in the office, and moderately noisy to noisy in the field.

POSITION TYPE/EXPECTED HOURS OF WORK:

This is a **part-time** position. Scheduled hours will be determined by the Fire Marshal based on operational needs. The position may occasionally require work outside scheduled hours, including evenings and weekends, depending on job assignments.

TRAVEL:

Travel is primarily local during the business day, although some out of the area travel and overnight may be expected for conferences and seminars.

VEHICLE STORAGE AGREEMENT

This Vehicle Storage Agreement (“Agreement”) is made this ___ day of _____, 20 (the “Effective Date”), by and between Gowans-Knight Co., Inc., a Connecticut corporation with a principal place of business at 50 Seemar Road, Watertown, Connecticut (“Gowans-Knight”), and the Town of Watertown, together with the individuals listed in Section 1 below (collectively, “Customer” or “Watertown”). Customer and Gowans-Knight may be referred to individually as a “Party” and collectively as the “Parties.”

By signing below, Customer acknowledges and agrees to be bound by all terms and conditions set forth herein.

All vehicles identified above shall hereinafter be collectively referred to as the “Vehicle(s).”

3. TERM AND PERIOD OF OCCUPANCY

The term of this Agreement ("Term") shall commence on the Effective Date and shall renew annually for the period beginning December 1 through March 31 of each year (a four-month storage period), unless earlier terminated in accordance with this Section.

Either Party may terminate this Agreement upon thirty (30) days' prior written notice. Customer remains responsible for all Rent accrued through the effective date of termination.

4. STORAGE SERVICES

In consideration for the Rent defined in Section 7, Gowans-Knight shall provide non-exclusive indoor storage of the Vehicle(s) at its facility located at 50 Seemar Road, Watertown, Connecticut (the "Facility").

Customer acknowledges that this Agreement grants a license to store, not a leasehold interest or any tenancy in real property.

5. ACCESS TO VEHICLE(S)

Customer may access the Vehicle(s) during reasonable business hours, provided Customer gives at least twenty-four (24) hours' advance notice to Gowans-Knight. Customer shall return the Vehicle(s) to the Facility at the end of each workday unless otherwise approved in writing by Gowans-Knight.

6. RESTRICTIONS; NO MECHANICAL WORK

No maintenance, mechanical repair, fueling, washing, modifications, or other work of any kind shall be performed on the Vehicle(s) inside or upon the Facility premises without the express written permission of Gowans-Knight. Customer shall comply with all Facility rules and safety policies as established by Gowans-Knight.

7. RENT AND PAYMENT TERMS

Customer shall pay Gowans-Knight the monthly sum of One Dollar (\$1.00) ("Rent"), with the full rent for the Term for each year due on the first day of the first month of the Term.

8. CONDITION OF FACILITY

Customer acknowledges that it has inspected the Facility and finds it suitable for Vehicle storage. Customer further acknowledges that the Facility is heated and equipped with a functional fire alarm and fire suppression system. Gowans-Knight makes no warranty, express or implied, regarding the condition, security, or environmental characteristics of the Facility, but will make reasonable attempts to notify Customer if any changes to the facility systems occur.

9. LIMITATION OF LIABILITY

Gowans-Knight shall not be liable for any loss of or damage to the Vehicle(s) or any personal property stored in or around the Vehicle(s), nor for any personal injury or property

damage occurring at the Facility, except to the extent such damage or injury is caused by the sole negligence of Gowans-Knight, its employees, or authorized agents.

Customer shall be responsible for all damage or loss caused in whole or in part by the acts or omissions of Customer, its employees, agents, contractors, or representatives.

10. NO INSURANCE PROVIDED BY GOWANS-KNIGHT

Customer acknowledges that Gowans-Knight does not insure the Vehicle(s) or any personal property of Customer. Customer is solely responsible for maintaining its own insurance coverage.

11. CUSTOMER INSURANCE REQUIREMENTS

Customer shall maintain at all times during the Term comprehensive automobile and property insurance covering the Vehicle(s), as well as general liability insurance, in commercially reasonable amounts. Upon request, Customer shall furnish Gowans-Knight with certificates of insurance evidencing compliance with this Section.

12. WAIVER OF SUBROGATION

Customer waives, and shall cause its insurers to waive, any right of subrogation or claim against Gowans-Knight for any loss or damage that is covered, or required to be covered, under Customer's insurance policies.

13. INDEMNIFICATION

To the fullest extent permitted by Connecticut law, Customer shall indemnify, defend, and hold harmless Gowans-Knight Co., Inc., its officers, directors, employees, contractors, and agents (collectively, the "Indemnified Parties") from and against any and all claims, demands, liabilities, damages, losses, fines, penalties, judgments, costs, and expenses (including reasonable attorneys' fees) arising out of or related to:

- (a) the storage, movement, use, operation, or condition of the Vehicle(s);
- (b) any act or omission of Customer, its employees, officials, agents, contractors, or representatives in connection with this Agreement or their presence at the Facility;
- (c) any breach of this Agreement by Customer; and
- (d) any violation of applicable laws or regulations by Customer.

However, the Town shall not be required to indemnify Gowans-Knight for claims to the extent they are caused by the sole negligence or willful misconduct of Gowans-Knight or its employees, consistent with Conn. Gen. Stat. § 52-572k.

This indemnification obligation shall survive the expiration or termination of this Agreement.

14. GOVERNING LAW

This Agreement shall be governed by, and construed in accordance with, the laws of the State of Connecticut, without regard to conflict-of-law principles. Any litigation arising out of or relating to this Agreement shall be brought exclusively in the Superior Court of Connecticut, with venue proper in Litchfield County, unless the Parties mutually agree otherwise.

15. ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This Agreement constitutes the entire understanding between the Parties with respect to the subject matter hereof and supersedes all prior or contemporaneous agreements, representations, or understandings, whether written or oral.

16. BINDING EFFECT

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the Parties and their respective successors and permitted assigns. Customer may not assign or transfer its rights under this Agreement without the prior written consent of Gowans-Knight.

17. SEVERABILITY

If any provision of this Agreement is deemed invalid, illegal, or unenforceable, the remaining provisions shall remain in full force and effect, as though such invalid or unenforceable provision had not been included.

18. NOTICES

All notices or other communications required or permitted under this Agreement shall be in writing and shall be deemed properly given:

- (a) when sent by certified mail, return receipt requested, postage prepaid; or
- (b) when delivered in person with written acknowledgment of receipt.

Notices to Customer shall be sent to the address set forth in Section 1, unless Customer provides a written notice of change of address.

19. AUTHORITY TO CONTRACT

Each Party represents that it has full authority to enter into this Agreement.

The Town of Watertown represents that execution of this Agreement has been duly authorized in accordance with all applicable municipal procedures, ordinances, and charter requirements.
